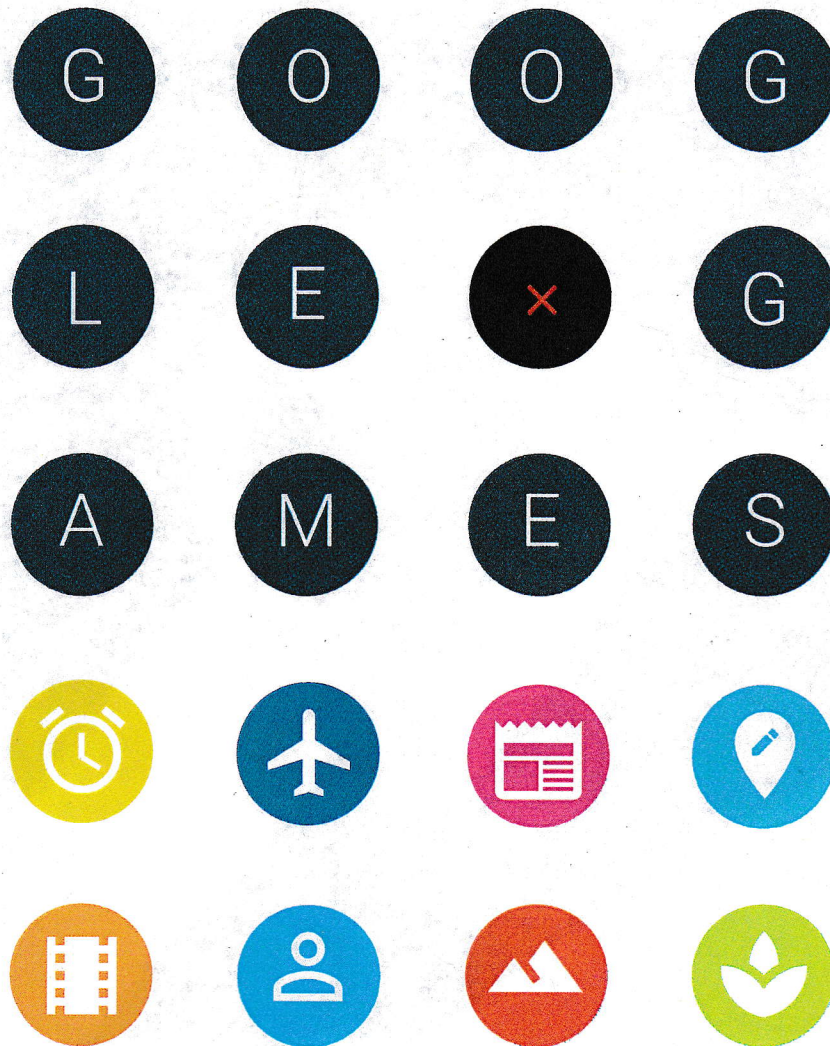

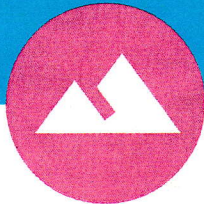

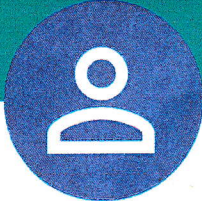


- Marty brought the reddest fruit.

Note: When something is "immediately" before, after, or adjacent to something else, it refers to the chronological sequence of the available years. e.g. 1215 is "immediately before" 1776.

Ghost in the Time Machine

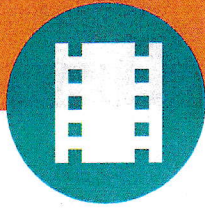

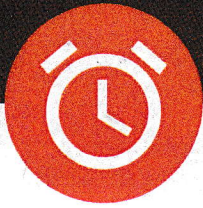

Time to Fly

Amelia Agnews, Brendan Balinski, Carlos Cadena, Delilah Dhillon, and Everest Edwards were all traveling via plane yesterday. Their flights left from and landed in the cities of Florentine City (Pacific Time), Grapefruitus (Alaska Time), Horchataville (Central Time), Italianopolis (Mountain Time), and Jelleypudding (Eastern Time). They left at 8 a.m. PT, 10 a.m. PT, noon PT, 2 p.m. PT, and 4 p.m. PT. The flights had durations between 2 and 6 hours, inclusive. Can you match each person to their departure/destination cities, departure/arrival times, and flight durations?



- Each flight had a different departure city. Each flight had a different arrival city.
- Each flight left at a different local time. Each flight landed at a different local time.
- Each flight left at a different time in PT. Each flight landed at a different time in PT.
- Each flight had a different duration, and each one lasted an integer number of hours.
- All flights landed in a different cities than they left (of course!)
- The local time that Delilah landed is the same numerically as the local time that a different flight left the Horchataville.
- Brendan landed one or two hours before Everest Edwards departed (in absolute time).
- Amelia's flight was longer (in duration) than the one from Florentine City to Jelleypudding.
- The threehour flight landed in Horchataville at 1 p.m. local time.
- Amelia, Brendan, and Everest Edwards had the shortest flights.
- A flight was leaving Italianopolis while Brendan's was simultaneously landing, but Brendan's was two time zones further east.
- The latest local time for arrival was 10 p.m.
- The local time that Brendan landed is the same numerically as the local time that a different flight left Grapefruitus.
- Amelia departed 6 hours before the fourhour flight did.
- Delilah left earlier than the flight from Horchataville to Italianopolis did.
